We will begin in the morning with all events for children aged 4 to 13, namely the kata division followed by semi-contact fighting. In the afternoon, we will proceed with the categories for ages 14 and up, namely the kata division, elite kata, followed by semi-contact kumite with equipment.

Registrations must be completed and received before October 11, 2026, in order for us to organize and finalize the categories.

General Information

Deadline for submission of registrations :

October 11, 2026. Any registration made after this date will be rejected. No on-site registration will be accepted.

Each dojo director must register their dojo by clicking on the registration link on the website www.budogiant.com so that their students can then register online. At the end of each registration, both the student who registered and the director of their dojo will receive a registration confirmation with all the details. It is the responsibility of each person to verify that all information is accurate and to contact the organizers in case of an error.

***** Please note that a participant's weight may be subject to verification by the competition officials and that a significant difference between the recorded weight and the verified weight (5 pounds or more) may result in the participant's disqualification without refund. *****

***Payment of registration fees:**

*On October 24, each dojo director must go to the "dojo director's table" in order to pay, in cash, the registration fees for all of their students. Volunteers will not ask each student to pay their individual registration fees at the time of their check-in.

Only one cash payment per dojo is required.

- The registration fee is \$65 per participant for one or two categories.
- Participants must be able to confirm their age with a valid photo ID at the time of check-in. Example: health insurance card/passport.
- A parent or legal guardian must sign the individual registration form for any participant aged 17 or under.

Budo Giant Challenge 2026

Categories and Subcategories

Registered participants will be grouped into pre-established categories according to the type of event, age, belt level, gender, and weight. Please refer to the category tables.

A minimum of 2 participants per category is required. If only one participant is registered in any given category, they will either be reassigned or refunded. If there are too many participants registered in the same category, that category will be subdivided into two or more subcategories (the organizers reserve the right to merge categories).

Guidelines for “Semi-Contact” participants:

- Participants in “Semi-Contact” fighting must be weighed by their dojo director so that each participant is placed in the correct weight category.
- Participants registered in the “Semi-Contact” competition must bring protective equipment that complies with the regulations in force (helmet, shin and foot protectors, gloves). A mouthguard and athletic supporter are optional but strongly recommended.

*****Disqualification without refund if the weight at the competition differs too greatly from the one recorded at registration (5 pounds or more) *****

Admission Fees for Spectators :

Ages 13 and over: 10\$

Ages 6-12: 5\$

Ages 5 and under: Free

Coaches

We are pleased to welcome, free of charge, the Director (or designated representative) of each participating dojo as well as his/her coaches. The established ratio is one coach for approximately **5 registered participants (maximum of 3 coaches per dojo)**. Any additional coaches must pay the spectator admission fee in order to access the gymnasium.

Coaches will receive a pass allowing them access to the competition area. The number of coaches permitted inside the competition area will be limited so as not to interfere with the work of referees and volunteers. This measure also ensures spectators a better view.

Dojo Director

- Upon arrival, the dojo director must report to the “dojo directors’ table”.
- The dojo director will receive their pass, the list of events for their students, and any other relevant documents, if applicable.
- The dojo director must notify organizers of any student absences, if applicable.
- The dojo director will receive the passes for their coaches. All coaches must wear their pass in order to access the competition area.
- The dojo director must pay the registration fees for their students.
- The head referee will meet with all directors and coaches before the start of the matches.
- The awarding of trophies for each category will take place as soon as the event has ended.

Coaches

The coaches designated by their dojo director will be responsible for the students of their dojo during the competition. Their main duties will be as follows:

- Ensure that their students promptly report to the table of the designated area (as announced).
- Ensure that their students participating in the competition wear the required equipment and remain near the competition area for the entire duration of the event.
- Ensure that their students behave courteously and demonstrate good sportsmanship.
- Ensure that the parents and friends of their students stay away from the competition area.
- **Only one coach per fighter** is permitted near the fighting area; failure to comply may result in the fighter’s disqualification.

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Kata Evaluation System

1. The BUDO GIANT CHALLENGE 2026 is open to all traditional karate styles.
2. Participants must wear the full dogi (no T-shirt permitted).
3. Kata categories are defined according to the participants' age and belt level (kyu).
4. **A judging panel is composed of 3 or 5 judges, including the chief judge who oversees the competition.**
5. Each participant presents themselves to the judges and announces the kata they will perform. The chosen kata must be identified in advance.
6. All participants must perform a traditional kata. A traditional kata is a sequence of traditional karate techniques that can be taught and performed by all members of an organization; it is a required element for belt promotion tests, and not a kata custom-made for one or a few members of an organization.
7. Each participant receives a score — between 5 and 10 — from each judge; the total of the 5 scores is used to establish the participant's standing within their category.
8. If a participant chooses to perform a "non-traditional" kata, they will be disqualified, and each judge will award them the minimum score of 5.
9. Since traditional kata vary from one style to another, each participant is judged according to the following criteria:
 - basic stances
 - kicking techniques
 - punching and shuto (knife-hand) techniques
 - balance and fluidity
 - attitude and intensity
 - speed and control
 - level of difficulty of the kata
 - Kiai
10. Judges also take into account consistency in the execution of techniques. If a participant performs the same technique multiple times within a kata and it appears different each time, they will be penalized.

11. In order for judges to establish a baseline for evaluation, the first 3 participants of a category perform their kata in succession without receiving their scores. Each then returns before the judges to receive their respective scores. From that point on, the other participants perform their kata and receive their scores immediately after performing.
12. Each participant's performance is evaluated in comparison to the other participants of the same category.
13. In the case of a tie for first, second, or third place within a category, the chief judge will ask the tied participants to perform their kata again in order to determine the winner of the tied position.
14. Participants from 4th kyu to black belt must be prepared to perform two distinct traditional katas: a first kata, and a second kata in case of a tie for one of the top three positions. If a participant chooses to perform the same kata twice, each judge will deduct half a point.

ELITE KATA (GREEN BELT AND ABOVE)

1. From 4th kyu to black belts, the kata evaluation system in effect will be the one frequently used in Japan. It is an elimination system similar to kumite competitions.
2. Two participants perform their kata in turn, and the judges decide which participant advances to the next round according to a flag system — aka (red) or shiro (white). Thus, in order to progress within their category, a participant will have to perform different katas in accordance with the rules.

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“Semi-Contact” Kumite Rules

1. KARATE CONTACT KUMITE WITH PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

A match involving two opponents who may strike each other “with force” provided they use legal techniques – as described in this document.

2. ELIGIBILITY

Fighters aged 5 and up, from 10th kyu (white belt) to black belt, grouped according to age, gender, kyu, and weight.

3. PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Mandatory protective equipment: shin and foot guards, gloves, helmet

- Mouthguard: strongly recommended for all fighters
- Mouthguard or helmet with face grid: mandatory for fighters with orthodontic braces
- Athletic supporter (groin protector): mandatory for male fighters
- **Chest protector (plastron) : mandatory for ages 10 and under**
- **Chest protector (plastron): prohibited for fighters 11 and over**
- Chest guard (worn under uniform) : for **female fighters 11 and over**



PERMITTED

Wrist or ankle bandages : **prohibited for all fighters in their first match**

No glasses

No jewelry

4. REFEREEING TEAM

- A refereeing team consists of a central referee who supervises the fight, 2 or 4 corner judges who evaluate the fighters, a timekeeper and a scorer.

5. COACHES

- Each fighter is allowed one (1) coach, who may represent them to an organizer in case of conflict.
- Only each fighter's coach may sit near the fighting area.
- Coaches are never allowed to enter the fighting area.

6. MATCH DURATION

- 1 ½ minutes for ages 13 and under
- 2 minutes for ages 14 and over
- 1 minute for the first and only overtime round – (in case of a tie)

7. LEGAL TECHNIQUES

- To the Legs (above the knees): roundhouse kicks and knee strikes
- To the Body : punches, elbow strikes, knee strikes, and kicks (straight and circular techniques)

*****HEAD STRIKES :**

Age 5–13 :

Only VERY light and controlled strikes to the head/helmet are permitted
Any attempt to knock out the opponent results in disqualification

Age 14–17 :

Only light and very controlled strikes to the head/helmet are permitted (U17)
Any attempt to knock out the opponent results in disqualification.

Age 18+ :

Only controlled strikes to the head/helmet are permitted
Any attempt to knock out the opponent results in disqualification.

8. ILLEGAL TECHNIQUES

- **Age 5 - 13: Roundhouse kicks to the head with force**
- Kicks to or below the knees
- Open-hand strikes, punches, elbow strikes, or headbutts to the **face, head, or neck**
- Any strikes (hand, fist, elbow, knee, foot) **to the groin or back**
- Direct knee or straight kick strikes **to the face**
- Grabbing
- Repeated pushing of the opponent

9. IPPON - WAZAARI

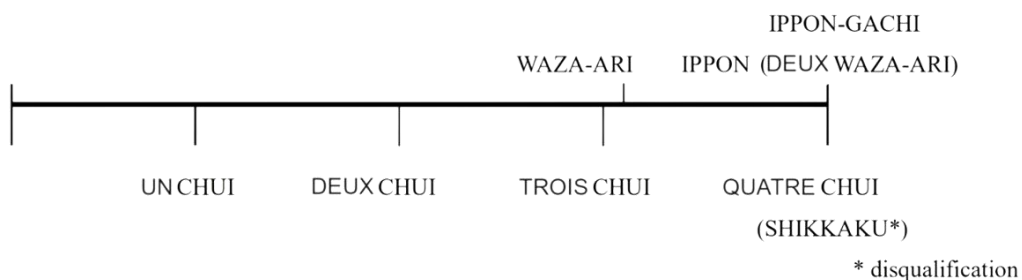
- **Ippon** : immediate victory following a legal technique that neutralizes or incapacitates the opponent for 3 seconds or more – Match ends
- **Waza-ari** : legal technique causing the opponent's inability to perform (loss of guard, awareness, or stability) for less than 3 seconds – Match resumes
- **Second Waza-ari** : results in immediate victory (Awasete Ippon) – Match ends
- An Ippon or Waza-ari must be observed and signaled by a majority of judges and referees (2/3 or 3/5).
- The match is interrupted by the central referee, who makes the official announcement of the Ippon or Waza-ari.

10. CHUI ET GENTEN - OFFICIAL WARNINGS AND PENALTIES

- Official warnings and penalties are awarded by a majority of judges and referee (at least 2/3 or 3/5). The match is stopped and the central referee announces the warning or penalty.
- **Chui**: official warning following an infraction
- **Genten Ichi**: 1st penalty following 2 official warnings
- **Genten Ni - Shikakku**: 2nd penalty following 2 more official warnings – Disqualification of the fighter – Immediate victory for the opponent

11. HOW TO WIN A MATCH

- By **Ippon** - Immediate victory
- With **two Waza-ari** – Immediate victory (Awasete Ippon)
- By **unanimous decision** based on tally of Waza-ari and/or penalties at the end of regulation time
- By **favorable decision of a majority of judges and referee** at the end of regulation time
- By **disqualification** of the opponent (**Shikakku**) – Immediate victory
- By **forfeit** (withdrawal from the match) of the opponent – Immediate victory

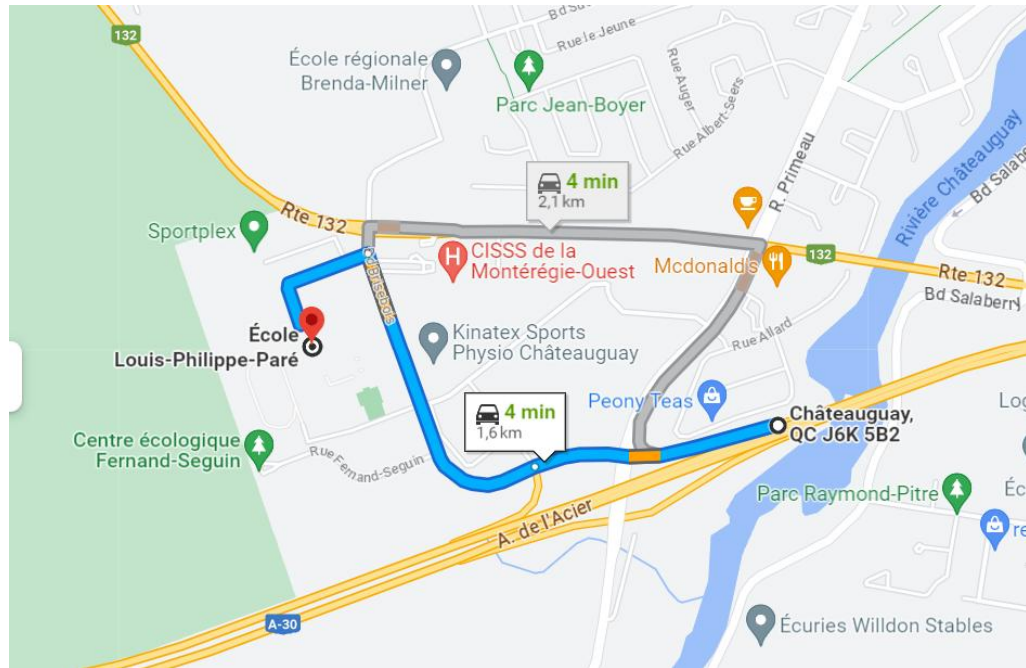
